Drinking Water Quality

• Anchorage Water & Wastewater Utility is committed to deliver the highest quality water.

Anchorage's drinking water exceeds all state and federal health-protective standards.

Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations limit the amount of contaminants in public water

systems.

EPA requires testing for over 80 contaminants. Many of these contaminants are virtually nonexistent in our drinking water. Only those detected are listed in the Drinking Water Table found in the annual Anchorage and Girdwood Drinking Water Quality Report.

Eklutna Lake is Anchorage's primary drinking water source.

Anchorage's major water source is a glacier fed mountain lake located in the pristine wilderness of Chugach State Park. Eklutna Lake is located high above residential and commercial development and is an exceptional high quality water source.

• The Utility's Water Treatment Facilities are state-of-the-art treatment facilities.

Eklutna and Ship Creek Water Treatment Facilities perform surface water treatment. Water Treatment reduces turbidity, removes contaminants and reduces the risk of pathogenic contamination.

Anchorage well water sources are naturally filtered.

Prior to distribution, well water is disinfected.
